1 Upon consideration of the Plaintiffs' Unopposed Motion for Approval of Proposed Class Action  
2 Settlement, the Court, having considered the papers submitted, all other related filings and materials, and  
3 the oral argument presented by counsel, **HEREBY ORDERS THAT:**

4 1. The Motion is **GRANTED**.

5 2. The capitalized terms in this Order Granting Approval of the Proposed Class Action  
6 Settlement shall have the same meaning as defined in the Settlement Agreement.

7 3. The Plaintiffs' Motion for Class Certification, ECF No. 44, is **GRANTED** for  
8 purposes of settlement only. The Court certifies the following pursuant to Rule 23(b)(2) of the Federal  
9 Rules of Civil Procedure:

10 All individuals identified under Section 2502(a)(1)(A) of the Extending  
11 Government Funding and Delivering Emergency Assistance Act, Pub. L.  
12 No. 117-43, 135 Stat. 344 (2021), who have filed or will file an application  
for asylum.

13 4. The Court finds that the proposed Settlement resulted from arms-length  
14 negotiations between highly experienced counsel under the auspices and with the assistance of an  
15 experienced and neutral mediator, the Honorable Susan van Keulen.

16 5. Pursuant to Rule 23(e) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, the Court hereby  
17 grants final approval of the Settlement on grounds that it is, in all respects, fair, reasonable, and adequate  
18 as to, and in the best interests of, the members of the Class, within the meaning of, and in compliance with  
19 all applicable requirements of, Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 23.

20 6. The Court will retain continuing and exclusive jurisdiction over the Parties and the  
21 Settlement Agreement to interpret, implement, administer, and enforce the Settlement Agreement  
22 according to its terms.
